#### Race History

Saturday 3<sup>rd</sup> June sees Ballymena Road Club, host the 2023 Red Hand Trophy Road Race. The Red Hand Trophy is one of the longest running road races in Ireland and was first run in 1968. Throughout the years the race has been won by many famous names including hat-tricks for the Promoting Club's late Billy Kerr (1975, 1977 & 1980) and Ryan Connor (2001, 2007 & 2009).

In 2022 the race was won by Gareth O'Neill (Team Caldwell Cycles)

The trophy itself dates back to 1896 when it was presented to the Red Hand Cycling Club which existed in Ballymena at the time. Known then as the Lancashire`s Lemon Soda Cup it was first presented to FJ McCann in July 1896 at a race around the cinder track at the Recreation Grounds (now Ballymena Showgrounds). The trophy was presented to Ballymena Road Club in 1968 by solicitor, the late Jack McCann and was named the Red Hand Trophy.

#### Race Overview and Responsibilities

The Blair International Red Hand Trophy is organised by Ballymena Road Club and promoted under the Cycling Ireland technical rules and regulations. All individuals who enter the race or are involved in the race are responsible for their own safety. They must understand that the roads are not closed. Accredited marshals will be placed in areas deemed higher risk and they will have the power to stop traffic however, riders should remain on the correct side of the road at all times.

#### **Support Vehicles**

Neutral service will not be provided by the organisers. Support vehicles are permitted on the circuit however, they must not follow behind the race unless given permission to do so by a Commissaire.

#### Race Radios

Race information will be broadcast on 453.5625 MHz. All race officials can collect a race radio from race headquarters prior to the event.

#### **Prize Presentation and Refreshments**

The prize presentation will take place at the Event HQ after the race. Everyone is welcome to attend and there will be tea/coffee and refreshments available




